




# **355** of 2003






Dr. Brown addressed his last senior class of Bryan College and was later presented with a set of very large and very loud windchimes so that he would not forget the sounds of Dayton.

All of the seniors stand in a "circle" in the front of the chapel and are asked to each hold the piece of a long red ribbon. The ribbon has the Bryan College emblem engraved into it. It is a visual symbol of how Bryan College has

unified the class for four years and is bound together. The president comes and cuts the ribbon between each senior, severing the circle and leaving each








The class of 2003 walked the stage with a record 151 graduates and 13 50th anniversary grads.






Exactly one year after the terrorist attack on the United States, Bryan College students, faculty, staff and Rhea county guests gathered together in Rudd auditorium to remember and honor the sacrifice of thousands. The idea of having a county wide memorial service at Bryan came after last year's prayer service around the courthouse on Septermber 13<sup>th</sup>, when the College and Dayton residents joined hands to pray for the nation. After the college's own tragedy two and a half years ago, it seemed ony fitting that Bryan and Rhea County should join hands again to remember the sacrifice made and to honor those who risked their lives.

County emergency personnel were invited along with the rest of the community. Police officers, fire fighters, EMTs, and hospital workers were all represented and recognized for their service to the community. Along with the desire to remember the lost and courageous of September 11, 2001 and February 6, 2000, Brown said that the service was also to remember the sacrifices made by many other Americans throughout history to preserve the freedom all Americans enjoy.

Dr. Doug Russell, pastor of Grace Bible Church and president of the Dayton Ministerial Association, gave the keynote address. Russell used many examples from the past, for example Pearl Harbor and the stock market crash, to remind the audience that America had been in this situation before. "We are faced with a decision. Are we going to choose to depend on God or are we going to depend on ourselves." He went on to say that a year ago, most Americans were on their knees before God praying for the nation. Now, a year after the terrorist attacks, America is still saying "United we stand," but not "In God we trust."

"Give me liberty or give me death" and "Free at last, free at last. Thank God Almighty, we are free at last," resounded from the stage as four Bryan students read speeches made by men like Patrick Henry, Abraham Lincoln, Martin Luther King Jr., and Ronald Reagan. The Bryan College Chamber Singers opened the service with the national anthem and the Chorale closed by singing a resounding rendition of "America the Beautiful."




This year's banquet took a journey to the mountains of North Carolina for a evening of fun and elegance. The three hour bus ride made it's first stop at an amazing buffet dinner.
